Adult Sunday School News

Formations Sunday School literature concludes a four-week unit of study entitled *Priorities*. This unit will consider the choices that we make in our everyday lives with regard to money, family, and church, and how we spend our time and resources. Each session will explore one area in which we must set priorities. The lessons will draw on a style of proverb in the Bible called “better than” sayings, in which the ancient sage (e.g., “wise person”) says a certain thing is “better than” something else that seems pretty good. It is important to realize that the ancient Israelite sages poked and prodded people to ask hard questions more than they provided clear-cut answers to those questions. This is especially true of Ecclesiastes, but even the straight teaching in Proverbs finally raises difficult moral and ethical dilemmas. The reason the sages did this was to help people make good choices based on clear guidelines, even when the situation was murky and the outcome was unsure. By looking at the world and ourselves with a clear eye, we will gain more perspective into how we fit into God’s vision for our lives and our world. Each session will begin with a “better than” saying in Proverbs or Ecclesiastes, explain something about how the Israelites understood the issues being addressed, and encourage readers to ask honest questions about how we go about setting our priorities. This week’s lesson, entitled *Hearing Truth Is More Important Than Liking What You Hear*, is based on Ecclesiastes 7:5, and Isaiah 30:8-11 and is studied in the following classes:

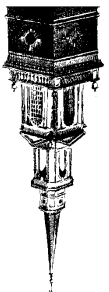
